TOP YOUNG BEAUTY THERAPISTS THROUGH TO WORLDSKILLS UK FINAL

Two outstanding Cambridge Regional students have reached the national finals of the hotly contested WorldSkills UK beauty competition.

Rachel Hine, 19, from Longstanton, and Katie Wright, 18, from St Ives, are among just ten trainee beauty therapists to be chosen from across the country to compete in the final.

The girls came first and second, with just one mark between them, at the eastern regional heat held at Cambridge Regional College.

Rachel, who entered the competition for the first time, came first and Katie was second. The impressed judges gave them both excellent marks, which were enough to put them in the top ten in the country from all 12 regional heats.

The pair will test their skills to the limit in the WorldSkills UK Advanced Beauty Competition in Derby on June 26.

CRC Beauty Therapy lecturer Emma Yeoman, said she was delighted by the achievement of Rachel and Katie.

“They are both very talented and skilled beauty therapists and we’re absolutely delighted that they came first and second in the regional competition and have made it into the finals,” she said.
