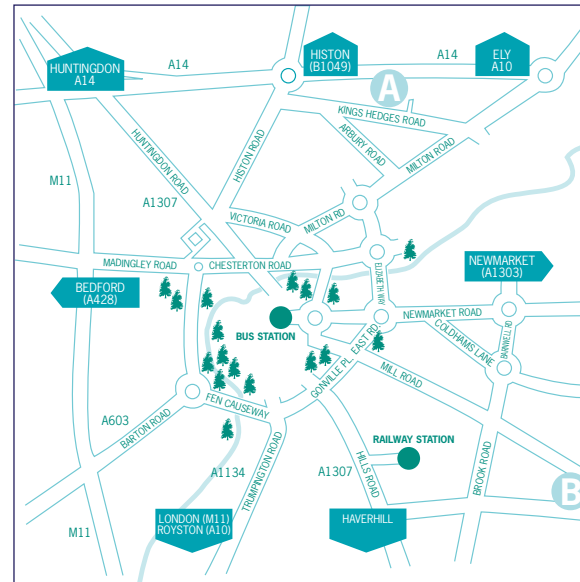

Cambridge Regional College Health Services are headed by a Registered Nurse with advance practice.

Student Health Centre (E035a) Opening Hours
8.00am – 9.00am daily

Drop in to Student Services Centre (C007a) and ask for Sue at the helpdesk.

What can CRC Health Services do?

- Students who have chronic medical conditions i.e diabetes, asthma, allergies can store medication and develop health support systems while in College.
- Register students with a local G.P
- General Health Information and Guidance
- Physical Assessment
- Referral to GP
- Referral to A & E at Addenbrooke's
- Sexual Health Services
- C Card Registration
- Chlamydia Testing
- Pregnancy Testing
- Pregnancy Options and Choices
- Abortion Referral Support

- Support Plans eg medical conditions or expectant mothers

Will it be confidential?

Health services and advice are confidential in virtually all circumstances, exceptions to this will be explained at your first meeting. Tutors or teaching staff will not be informed of your appointment or visit unless you want them to be.

How will information about me be kept?

Written records conform with the Data Protection Act of 1998 and are kept securely and destroyed after 6 years. You are entitled to see these records.

How will your information be used?

No personal details will be passed on without your consent. However, your generic information may be used for data and research.
